8:30-10:00 Dave Singh PhD, DDS: "Pneumopedics: Non-surgical Upper Airway Remodeling for OSA" Introduction to the principles of Pneumopedics, which is defined as non-surgical, upper airway remodeling. Gain an understanding of craniofacial epigenetics. Introduction to the concept of biomimicry, as the Pneumopedics technique relies upon a sound knowledge of biomimetic appliances. Clinical applications of these concepts to obstructive sleep apnea in multi-disciplinary and inter-disciplinary settings will be offered.

10:45-12:15 Robert Whitman MSE: "Sex, Drugs & Oral CancerTM" Recent trends in oral cancer have heightened the importance of a proper oral cancer screening protocol for all medical and dental professionals. Oral cancer has risen each of the past seven years, and the deforming disease is now affecting patients with no traditional risk factors. Due to a 225% increase in HPV related oropharyngeal cancers, oral cancer is occurring in younger populations, changing the perception of who to screen. With the need for a new oral cancer screening protocol, adjunctive screening options will be covered in detail. This course will introduce recent and emerging technologies for early discovery of oral cancer, including fluorescence technology and quantitative cytology, along with the importance of proper implementation. Clinical examples of these procedures will also be provided.

2:00-4:00 Sally Fallon Morell: "Nourishing Traditional Diets for Perfect Dental Health" Dr. Weston A. Price described fourteen primitive cultures that had perfect dental health – freedom from caries and no dental deformities. They had uniformly straight teeth. He described the diets that conferred good health on these populations. This talk will describe the principles of healthy diets, with particular

emphasis on the fat-soluble vitamins A, D and K2 as needed in pre-pregnancy and pregnancy diets, when the teeth are being formed.

8:30-10:00 Thomas E. Levy, MD, JD: "Coronary Heart Disease, Pathophysiology and Its Relation to the Root Canal-Treated Tooth" The correlation between coronary heart disease and chronic periodontal disease has been recognized and well-established for some years now. The scientific literature is now increasingly demonstrating the link between coronary atherosclerosis and root canal-treated teeth, which harbor the same spectrum of pathogens in an oxygen-deprived environment as the deep-seated periodontal infections.

The reasons for this link will be explored in some depth, including the evidence that the chronic seeding of such oral pathogens and toxins in the coronary endothelium induces a focal, chronic, and pronounced scurvy in this area. Cardiology currently recognizes that atherosclerosis of the coronary arteries is always initiated by inflammation in the endocardium and inner wall, yet there is little to no questioning as to why this inflammation should be so common as to impact the mortality of roughly half of the population.

10:30-12:00 John Roberts BDSc: "Physiological Regulating Medicine (PRM) 22nd Century Medicine" PRM is a natural evolution for modern health care, blending homeopathic and modern biochemical medicine. It is not a monomedicine; rather, it is a combination of many remedies – interleukins, cytokines used to enhance general and dental medicine. Its principals work with Psycho-Neuro-Endocrine-Immunology (PNEI) to rebalance the body to health.

1:30-3:00 Felix Liao, DDS: "6 Foot Tiger, 3 Foot Cage: Why Teeth Grinding Is Now Sleep Bruxing Airway Disorder" Teeth grinding is not simply a dental problem; it's an airway crisis during sleep, with chronic oxygen deficiency as oral-systemic outcome. The tongue is the big obstructor in obstructive sleep apnea. Biological dentists are in a pivotal position to help patients with airway obstruction during sleep upgrade their total health, mind-body-mouth. Topics include: Connecting Snoring, Sleep Apnea, and Sleep Bruxing; The Tongue as 6 Foot Tiger in 3 Foot cage; Oral-Facial-Postural Signs and Systemic Complications of Snoring; Sleep Apnea; Holistic Mouth Solutions for Sleep Bruxing Airway Disorder; Research Evidence and Case Reports.

How advanced techniques in molecular biology allow the highly specific and sensitive detection of microbes that contain either DNA or RNA. How PCR works and how primers are designed and tested for high specificity using BLAST. How this technology can be used to detect Lyme and its co-infectors, bacteria, fungi and viruses, ApoE and gluten intolerance, and hereditary genes for cancer (ie. BRCA 1 and 2, prostate cancer, p53, p21 and more.
